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

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Are you a Mojito?

The simple cocktail is not just a drink. It is in fact an art form, glasses filled like mini art installations. It tells a story through the name and inspiration behind its creation while the “acrobatics” of making the drink enhances the drama. Seizing on Vietnam’s emerging cocktail culture, the bars of the La Siesta Resort have designed a selection of cutting-edge cocktail menus featuring classic, contemporary and unique recipes. One such cocktail is the classic Cuban born Mojito – one of the most famous rum-based highballs, of which there are a several varieties. This cocktail traditionally consists of five ingredients: white rum, sugar cane juice, lime juice, soda water and mint, topped with crushed ice. There are a number of legends and theories relating to the Mojito’s origins. One story links it to Sir Francis Drake when a similar drink was devised as a medicine to combat tropical diseases. Others attribute the drink to African slaves working on Cuban sugar cane fields. Author Ernest Hemingway was one person who made the Mojito really famous and popular when he lived in Havana. Today’s statistics indicate the drink was the most popular cocktail in Britain and France a few years ago.

The Mojito, Cuba’s unofficial national drink, remains one of the most refreshing cocktails around. At Red Bean and the Temple bars, we have devised some great pre-summer thirst quenching spins on the original recipe.



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Da Nang and the land of the Cham



Scan here, get there!

Let us tempt you with our full day tour by private car to the city of Da Nang and surrounding area. Da Nang is one of Vietnam's international gateways, a major port and the largest city in central Vietnam-much of its history dates from the Champa Kingdom.

On arrival in Da Nang we visit the Linh Ung Pagoda on Son Tra Peninsula where, in the courtyard, is the amazing and stunning statue of the Lady Buddha, Goddess of Mercy. This immense 67m high statue is the equivalent to a 30-storey building, standing on a 35m diameter lotus flower carving. On Lady Buddha's hat is a Buddha statue 2m high. The statue faces the sea - one of her hands exorcises, the other holds a bottle of holy water. For the energetic, a climb up inside the statue reveals an altar on each of the 17 floors with 21 Buddha statues featuring different characteristics. The climb leads to stunning views from the top.

Marble Mountain is a well-known pilgrimage site with peaks, caves, tunnels and temples, a group of five limestone and marble hills named after the five elements, Metal, Wood, Water, Fire, and Earth. The mountains are climbed for their spectacular views, the Water Mountain being the most popular with pagodas dating from the 17th century as well as caves. To reach the Tam Quan Gate involves climbing up 150 steep stone steps but the view to Mount Kim Son (Metal Mountain) is rewarding. The most beautiful observatory spot is the Riverview Tower.

We also visit the Museum of Cham Sculpture, the largest such exhibition in the world with 300 items on display dating from the 7th to 15th centuries, many considered masterpieces. The museum's façade is decorated with carved symbols of Hinduism.

We then take a southerly route enjoying coastal and beach scenery to lunch at a traditional restaurant, after which we join the Hai Van Pass, an unmissable experience. At 500m above sea level, it is the highest pass in Vietnam.

Then it is back to the hotel. Our tour includes private car, English speaking guide, entrance fees, lunch and water.

The River of Remembrance



The Hoai River, which is also known as the River of Remembrance, is a small tributary of the Thu Bon River that flows through Hoi An. The locals regard it as a symbol of the town, making it even more beautiful and romantic.

During the day, the river is tremendously busy, full with the boats of local people plying their various trades, but at night it attains a very special magic when the streets along both banks of the river are ablaze with lights from the colored lanterns, creating a beautiful ambience.

If you are lucky enough, the best time to see the Hoai River at its most beautiful is the night of the full moon. On the night of the 14th of every lunar month, the townspeople turn off the lights in their homes and hang decorative colored lanterns in front of their houses, a practice that has lasted for three hundred years. Also on full moon night, hundreds of floating lanterns are released on the river, gliding down the quiet water in a stunning showcase of breathtaking beauty.

To hire a boat on the River at night is a "must do" for any visitor to Hoi An. There are several options available from the smart dinner cruise to a simple wooden boat steered by a ferryman. Whichever you choose, sail on the Hoai river and immerse yourself in the atmosphere of Hoi An as it was a century ago. The River at night is as quiet as it is iconic and poetic.

The dinner cruises start and finish at the pier opposite Bach Dang, and last a leisurely two hours, starting at sunset. This is a relaxing and perfect way to unwind after a day's sightseeing. You are escorted aboard to a private table, with complimentary cocktail and nibbles. For dinner, sample the ocean's fresh produce, together with a selection of fine wines and a dessert of tropical fruits. There is no tour guide but the crew are happy to answer questions and it is an excellent opportunity to learn more about local history and see some of the lesser-known areas of Hoi An.

A simpler, but equally enjoyable way to sail the Hoai River at night is by wooden boat, such as a Ghe Bau. These boats have no motors so the whole experience is as if going back in time as the ferryman slowly moves the paddle forward, at the same time relating interesting stories about the area. Sit back and relax as you float down the river in the soft yellow light from a hurricane lamp hanging on the mast. Listen to the soft strains of a guitarist and the special songs of the girls as you pass the Quang area, the sound of which spreads across the river. The latter shines with the lights from the colored lanterns, imbuing a fairytale quality. Float your own candle lantern on the water whilst making a wish - possibly that you will return to Hoi An and to the Hoai River one day.

Tickets for the boats can be obtained from the Hoi An Tourist Office.

Art for a better community



About 42 km south of Hoi An, along Thanh Nien Road, can be found an explosion of color this is the Mural Village of Tam Thanh. The village, inspired by South Korean mural villages, is a joint initiative by the Korean Community Art Exchange Program and the Vietnamese People's Committee of Quang Nam Province.

The project, begun in the summer of 2016 and completed a mere twenty days later, is a huge achievement. Involved were five South Korean artists, seven Vietnamese artists and a few local volunteers who, between them, painted over one hundred murals, mainly on the walls of houses but also in unexpected places such as around corners and down alleyways.



Tam Thanh village was specially chosen for the project because of the high density of houses in a relatively small area, thus creating an 'easy-to-view' gallery effect for the murals. It is the first project of its kind in Vietnam and strives to boost local tourism and hence the economy of the village, which is a poor fishing community. The tagline is "art for a better community" and the village is now on the "must see" list for travelers and locals alike. The village is home to 20 or 30 very close-knit families who scrape together a living from the sea, having missed out on the economic transformation that has taken place in Hoi An, Ho Chi Minh and Hanoi.

The murals are vivid and bold, painted in a kaleidoscope of color - pinks and blues, yellows and greens, reds and deep violet. The façade of every house sports a unique mural, depicting scenes from everyday life of the local people, their culture and surrounding nature. As an example, the mural on the tailor's house depicts him working at his sewing machine whilst his family are included in the picture too. There are murals with wonderful local faces, both young and old, and scenes showing working activities mostly relating to the sea and the fishing industry. Included too are leisure pursuits, children playing volleyball and the art of paper-dart throwing. Flowers, trees, animals and birds depict nature.

The murals have brought a surge of interest to the village. A Community Tourism project has been launched while a Communal Arts Village and a nearby two-mile seaside walkway decorated with colorful coracles will open soon. The underlying message of the project is that art should not purely be the reserve of the privileged but that it can be a way of bringing people together.

So, hire a motorbike or take a car with driver and pay a visit to Tam Thanh Mural Village, explore this delightful place and be prepared for wonderful surprises. The local inhabitants are very pleased to show visitors around the murals and talk about their families and village life. It makes for a colorful day out to a beautiful place, which is a photographer's dream.
